The Importance of Theology (Especially during Advent)

Well, it's happening again. We are now into at least year 15 of the Christmas shopping season beginning after Halloween and not Thanksgiving. After all who can wait, retailers certainly cannot. Doorbuster deals and all the rest begin a week, sometimes ten days before Thanksgiving, and the hew and cry goes up on Facebook lamenting such consumerism (these posts always fail to mention of course that once the appropriate length of time has gone past consumption will commence, just not too soon.) Maybe we are in a hurry as a culture because we are continually disappointed with how things are turning out. We place our hopes in a politician and they fail to deliver on promises. The news gets us down but we feel it is not our place to speak up, or more often we are driven into silence by the fear that we might lose our precious security. Every year Facebook blows up with the hopes of people yearning for a better year, next year. We have lost the art of waiting. Theology is most properly defined as faith meeting understanding. Understanding takes an awful long time.

So then what are we Christians to do in the midst of all of this. Of course, you have heard it said that we should slow down in these seasons of busyness and I would certainly encourage the same. But I would also go deeper. The reality is much more stark in contrast. The people of God wait, and wait. It isn't so much a question of slowing down so that they don't imitate the culture as much as we do, but rather to wait on the promises of God to be fulfilled which is actually subversive. All human beings go through seasons of busyness and slowness but the church takes time to go through a season of waiting. It was the custom for many years, if not centuries, that homes were not decorated for Christmas until Christmas Day!

The church, in its theology, and practice, practices patience, believing the the Lord will provide us with the one who can save us, while the world tries to save itself. Advent is a time when the people wait in darkness for the coming light. Advent is a time, when the people recognize their need for salvation and await the one who will bring that salvation. The world tells us to save ourselves, and our relationships through the gift of consumption. The church knows that it is not the giving of gifts which reconciles the peoples of the world (as wonderful as it is to give and receive), it is the building of deep relationships which will ultimately heal us. It is being with one another just as Christ seeks to be with us, that will bind the wounds we have caused. So be patient and loving and present to those around you this Advent and know that the light which the darkness cannot overcome is coming into the world.

MORAVIAN STAR

The first Moravian stars were made about 1850 by a teacher in a Moravian school in Niesky, Germany. The star is displayed from the first Sunday in Advent until Epiphany (January 7).

The illuminated Moravian star with its 26 points symbolizes the birth of Christ, leading the wise men that followed the star to Bethlehem. It is to remind us of the Old Testament prophecy:

"There shall come a star out of Jacob," (Numbers 24:17) and of the fulfillment of that prophecy in the coming of Christ who said, "I am the bright star of dawn". (Revelations 22:16)

This is the reason we hang one over our sanctuary Christmas tree!

WHAT IS A CHRISMON?

The Chrismon ornaments were first developed by Frances Kipps Spencer (1917-1990) at Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, Virginia. She originated them in 1957 when she set out to create decorations appropriate for a church Christmas tree.



THE CHRISMONS TREE

An evergreen tree, which symbolizes the eternal life, which our savior has provided for us, forms the background for tiny white lights and gold Chrismon designs. The lights speak of Him who is the light of the world, and the Chrismon ornaments portray Christ's Life.

CHRISMON = CHRISt + MONogram

proclaim the name, the life, and the saving acts of Jesus the Christ.

Some Chrismon designs are simple copies of symbols of Christianity from its earliest days - biblical and theological that are known by most believers. They're interdenominational and the heritage of all Christians.

Chrismons are white with gold decorations of beads, ribbon, glitter, etc.

Our chrismons were needlepointed by the Heritage women for almost a year, many years ago. Recently they were repaired by Bobbie Berg, Marilyn Bond, Carol Harvey, and Mary Thomson. Ginny Trunick has repaired the crowns and the star over the years.
