POW-WOW WITH PASTOR BRIAN

There is a very famous passage in Scripture, 1 John 4:18, that says "perfect love casts out fear," I love this passage because to whomever John was writing there is no way that it did not ring true either universally or simply in light of who Jesus revealed himself to be. God is perfect love and when we trust in that love the fear and anxiety that we feel from any aspect of our lives is diminished if not outright shattered. The problem for us in our culture and depending on our view of things is that the corollary is also true, perfect fear casts out love. As we move into our first ever Stewardship Season in the Spring it is important to look at the things of which we may still be afraid even when seen in the light of the resurrection.

I wonder sometimes what it would really look like for the church to take the actions of the early church briefly reported in Acts 2 seriously. There it says the church, "held all things in common, shared with each member according to their need, daily attended to prayer, and enjoyed the good will of all the people." It's a nice thought, but even for Luke who wrote Acts this ideal is short lived, by chapter five members of the church are withholding goods and money and pay with their lives; Ananias and Sapphira are representative of the extreme opposite of the Acts 2 ideal. But their story is interesting, they hold something back, they are afraid of something, maybe that the church is not all they thought it would be. Maybe they are afraid the funds won't be used well or will go to something they do not like. It really doesn't matter all that matters is that they are worried.

The Acts 2 church is short lived. Before you know it the people are holding back some of what they have, being persecuted by people like Saul of Tarsus (so there goes the good will of all the people,) being scattered around the countryside, and trying to figure out if Gentiles can be followers of Jesus Christ. It's nice to have an ideal to shoot for but let's be honest, ideals are rarely realized. This is still true for the church today. Far from enjoying the goodwill of all the people the church today often finds itself defending its existence within the wider culture. This is not to say that place we once held at the top of the cultural food chain was appropriate; just that there are those who would just as soon see the church no longer exist. In addition to this the two largest expenses a church incurs are the salary of the pastor and property maintenance. While I am deeply grateful for your generosity towards me, and love worshipping and doing ministry in our building this doesn't seem to line up well with the Acts 2 ideal.

But then stewardship is not about living up to an ideal anymore than pledging to the church is about what the budget will be spent on. Stewardship in the light of the resurrection is about letting go of those things we are afraid of, so that the resources we think we have to pour into keeping the wolves at bay can be used for God's kingdom purposes (perhaps in the next article I will discuss the kingdom purposes of paying the pastor's salary.) The truth is though that stewardship in the church has less to do with the amount of money we give and much more to do with letting go of the fear we have if the money is no longer in our pockets but in the hands of God. Godly stewardship in American culture resides squarely at the empty tomb of Christ, where an angel tells us not to fear but to use all our effort to get back to Galilee so that we might see him there. When we get there we may still have some fear but then Jesus will tell us to "fear not." As you discern how your gifts will be used in 2017 and beyond, think not only about the amount you think you can give to the church but also about how much you would give if were you completely unafraid to do so.
