POW-WOW WITH PASTOR BRIAN

It can sometimes be very difficult to let things go. We hold onto our children for dear life and as they grow up the prospect of having to send them to college, the military, or the world of work can begin to weigh on us, even frighten us. It can be difficult to let go of our agendas for others. We often encounter people and assume that we know what they need, what will "fix" them. The truth is more often the complete opposite, that we often have no idea, and only by shedding ourselves of our assumptions and biases will we be able to get to the heart of the matter.

Nowhere is the need to let go more prevalent than when it comes to our ministries. We often believe that ministry belongs to us. That our programming, our staffing models and our stewardship will get the job done for God. While there is certainly a place for good programming, good staffing, and good stewardship, we engage in all of those things because of what God has already done for us. In his book *The Crucifixion of Ministry* author Andrew Purves recounts his colleague recounting to his students a special lesson: he holds up a key and offers three ways by which the students may obtain it. There is the way of medieval Catholicism in which you climb the upward ladder and grab the key. There is the way of protestant pietism and prosperity gospel preaching, in which you have to get up and come forward. Finally, the professor walks over to the student, places the key in her hand, and tells her to keep the room clean. This is the way of real grace offered in Jesus Christ.

Your responsibility is not to try and say *Amen* in your own strength, as if everything depends on you, and it certainly isn't to get someone else to say *Amen* as though their salvation is somehow in your hands. No, your responsibility is say *Amen* to the *Amen* Christ says on our behalf and in us now in the Power of the Holy Spirit. Self-reliance, in the cultural sense has no place in the church, rather we rely on each other to mutually love, forgive and demonstrate what God is doing. Personal responsibility towards others and towards yourself is certainly a key part of our witness but only insofar as we have within us the mind of Christ, marked primarily by a self-giving love that draws others in. Heritage Continues to Serve Single Moms and their Children

It is hard to believe, but we are headed into our third season of serving single moms and their children. With your support, we have served 34 meals and spent more than 70 hours with these precious families. We also organized a clothing boutique for the moms, provided Christmas gifts, celebrated birthdays and much more. The moms have said many times over how much they appreciate all that we do for them. The generous love and support of the Heritage family is impacting their lives in very meaningful ways.

One important thing to note is the name has changed from SPIN to CARE. Many people were confusing the name SPIN with a type of exercise so they chose a new name. **CARE** stands for Courageous, Anchored, Resilient, Empowered. It will likely take us awhile to get used to the new name, but whatever we call it, we are still serving single moms and their kids.

CARE meets the first and third Wednesday of the month and it takes at least 15 Heritage volunteers to ensure the night runs smoothly. We continue to need volunteers to fill a variety of roles. Each job takes no longer than two hours and you can come only to do your job or do your job and stay for dinner. It really is a great night, talking with the moms, having fun with the kids and hanging out with Heritage friends.

A primary need is help providing dinner. In the past, groups such as MFC, Body and Soul, and our youth group have prepared dinner. Al and Nancy Welle and Scott and Linda Campbell have also prepared delicious meals that were enjoyed by all. In addition to the main meal, we need salad and dessert makers each time. We will also gladly accept monetary donations for the CARE Dinner Fund. This is used periodically to purchase meal items when no one is signed up to make dinner.

Volunteers are also needed to help with dinner set up, clean-up and hanging out with the kids. The kids are divided into three groups: preschool/elementary, middle school and teens. We help them with homework, play games, make crafts, play outside and more. We would love to have you join us and know you would enjoy the evening serving these precious families.
